More AA's ante up with new \$7.27 Seventh Tradition donation surge

Monthly SENY Area 49 newsletter *The Link* reported in its December 2017 issue that the General Service Office has noted "a groundswell" of Seventh Tradition contributions in the amount of \$7.27 — the dollar amount that has been estimated by the General Service Board treasurer as the average cost per member for G.S.O. to provide A.A. services to the Fellowship.

Each year, the treasurer calculates an average member contribution based on that year's financial position. It seems that members of the Fellowship have recently begun to "latch onto" this number, reports The Link, sending contributions to G.S.O. in that latest exact dollar amount.

The practice reportedly began in the Pacific Northwest and then "swept across" the eight regions and 93 areas of the U.S. and Canada. This reflects "the commitment of individual members to supporting the services that G.S.O. provides," according to *The Link*. What's more, there was even a "unique surge" of contributions of \$7.27 apiece sent to G.S.O. in New York last year — on July 27 (7/27), of all dates. Members can set up onetime or recurring donations at *aa.org*. — *By Ken K.*
