Participation in Delegate's Day of Sharing, questionnaire on the up

BROOKLYN, N.Y. — Numbers are up across the board for area participation in preparatory events leading up to this year's A.A. General Service Conference this month in New York. According the SENY Area 49 Delegate John W., more people attended the March 3 Delegate's Day of Sharing and submitted Delegate's Questionnaires by the April 8 deadline than ever before.

"We had around 325 people for the 'DDoS' on March 3," he said. "A past delegate told me that it was by far the largest and most enthusiastic turnout he'd ever seen at a DDoS.




"I'm grateful the fellowship in SENY is so engaged," John W. added. The questionnaire response rate hovered around 20%, with 400 completed questionnaires submitted. There are approximately 2,000 groups in the SENY area. This represented an increase of nearly 30% over last year's response rate, according to John.

The purpose behind the DDoS and the questionnaire to help SENY's area delegate to prepare for the GSC, he noted. "A critical component of that preparedness is having a good sense of the collective conscience of our area on some of the important matters that will be addressed," John said. "I now head off to the GSC informed — but not instructed — and vote in the best interest of AA as a whole." — Ken K.

The purpose of the trip was to respond to an invitation from the Cuban General Service Board to attend their 18th General Service Conference, which was held March 23-26 in the town of Caibarién. "Despite some of the roadblocks facing them," Greg says, "people in Cuba are truly passionate about A.A." (Cuba celebrated 25 years of AA at their National Convention which took place January 19-21, 2018, in Santa Clara, Cuba.)

India is part — I was delighted that they have started what could be the beginning of many women's conventions," says Heather.

"There are numerous countries where culture hinders recovery for women, and by talking one to one — as well as listening to stories and presentations from each other in conventions such as this — we will hopefully see a huge growth of women no longer dying from alcoholism."

A.A. continues to spread in **Iran** as the Iranian government, faced with a rise in alcoholism and drug abuse, has tolerated the open growth of more and more A.A. meetings. Iranian World Service Meeting delegate Masood F. writes, "A few years ago it was a ridiculous dream to share about alcoholism in an Islamic country like Iran. Now, the good news is that anyone who suffers from alcoholism in Iran should be able to find a meeting and speak about his or her problem."

Masood estimates that there are roughly 400 A.A. groups in the country, at least a quarter of them linked to Iran's General Service Office. "Contact with other countries, especially with the U.S./ Canada General Service Office, has been beneficial and even vital to us."
