

### **AA World Services, General Service** Office launch new YouTube channel

NEW YORK — GSO newsletter Box 459 reports that a YouTube channel has been launched for A.A. World Services and the A.A.General Service Office. The channel can be found at www.youtube.com/AlcoholicsAnonymousWorldServicesInc.

According to the newsletter, the purpose of the channel is "to provide an additional platform from which A.A.W.S-produced videos can be shared with a broader audience in order to enhance carrying the message to alcoholics, the general public and the professional community." Development began last fall in response to an Advisory Action of the 2017 General Service Conference to develop a YouTube presence, with comments function disabled, that could "be analyzed for effectiveness."



The channel launched with three Conference-approved public service announcements: "Doors," "My World" and "I Have Hope," available in English, Spanish and French. Expansion of content is reportedly currently underway, and staff are working on a process for posting content to the channel in a manner consistent with A.A. principles and A.A.W.S. copyrights.
