Registration open for 51st annual **SENY Convention in March 2019**

TARRYTOWN, N.Y. — The 51st SENY Area 49 Convention themed "Our Big Book: 80 Years, 71 Languages" — will be held March 22 to 24 at the Westchester Marriott Hotel here. Registration costs \$20 per person or, with banquet, \$90 per person. The Marriott is offering a special room rate of \$134 plus tax for overnight stays. Both convention registration and hotel room reservations booking are available online at www.aaseny.org/seny-convention. Printable hard-copy registration forms are also available for download at the site.

The purpose of the convention is, according to the official event website, "to provide meetings and workshops on Recovery, Unity and Service, but most of all to provide an atmosphere for all participants to have fun and fellowship." Highlights will include themed meetings, panels and workshops; alcothons; a banquet; a dance; a hospitality room; Spanish-language A.A. and Al-Anon meetings; displays of A.A. archives and videos; evening entertainment; and more.
