Colleen (DCMC):

- Attended the last Area Committee Meeting as well as a meeting of all the Intergroups. Here are some updates, just to keep you all informed:
- The SENY handbook has been updated and can be viewed online at aaseny.org. Please direct new GSRs to this resource.
- The Virtual General Service Conference did happen, but it was a truncated event. In regard to some literature items, they have been pushed back to the 71st GSC (2021). This includes the Spanish language 4th Edition of the Big Book and the language of the Preamble. But they are under advisement. The Literature Committee has been asked to bring more information and suggestions. Not as well researched because the period of research was cut down because of the virus.
